Q1. In Vitro fertilization, assisted birth technology (ART) and surrogacy among other methods in reproductive technology still remains a dilemma in Kenya's legal regulatory framework. The Technology has been linked to an increasing rate of genetic defects, without the existence of a registry or guidelines. A story is told of a 32yr old healthy woman. She was diagnosed and underwent assisted birth process. Initially and up to the seventh week, she exhibited a viable pregnancy. At 13 weeks, four days, an abnormal mass was detected prompting the doctors to initiate further investigations which revealed abnormalities on the fetus, hence the advice to terminate the pregnancy. On abortion, the fetus was found to have abdominal organs placed outside the body. In light of ethics and the principles of law, discuss the foregoing, taking into consideration aspects of reproductive technologies and the position of the law on abortion.

Her mother refused to take her to hospital for a simple procedure to remove the extra toes because she thinks that would be finding fault with God's perfect work. Without her mother's knowledge, she goes to a local hospital and has the surgery done. After learning of this, the mother sues the doctor for performing unconsented surgery.
- a). Will the mother's assertion that Jodie cannot give consent for the surgery stand? (10 marks).
- b). What exceptions exist in law for the requirement of informed consent before any medical treatment is administered? (10 Marks)

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
