- Q1. With reference to two texts covered in this course, critically analyse five ways in which the African oral tradition has influenced the artistic and aesthetic characteristic of African Literature. (30 marks)
- Q2. Making close reference to the nonfiction *Something Torn and New: An African Renaissance*, critically analyse Ngugi wa Thiongo's perspective on the role of Europe in shaping the form and content of African Literature. Focus on five points. (20 marks)
- Q3. It has been argued that the African literary artist has a social responsibility to art and to the society. Evaluate this statement with illustrations drawn from two texts read for this course. (20 marks)
- Q4. Evaluate the literary strengths of two texts covered in this course as works that display the distinctive nature of African Literature. Focus on THREE points from each text. (20 marks)
- Q5 Either
 - With reference to one text read for this course, discuss **five** points in response to the view that the African literary text is dynamic and authors engage in a search for alternative strategies of expression. (20 marks)
