  - b) Explain in detail the local system and the international system you have selected as the best mode of protecting. (20 Marks)
  - c) In the system you have identified above, explain the repercussions of expungement within 5 years in the country of origin. (6
    Marks)
- Q2. Geographical indications (GIs) in Kenya are registered as a Trade Mark under the Trade Marks Act Cap 506 for want of a GI legislation. In your opinion, is this justice to this type of IPR? Discuss. (20 Marks)
- Q3. "Copyrights are a bundle of rights which give the owner, negative rights." Discuss this statement, giving the significance of the Berne Convention in copyright.
